Patrick Leigh Fermor and Bruce Chatwin: Studies in Time

Bruce Chatwin and Patrick Leigh Fermor, two friends, Englishmen, travellers, writers, raconteurs, bon vivants, both with prodigious knowledge, were nevertheless very different in their approach to writing. In life too Chatwin tried to capture the moment, while Leigh Fermor regularly called a halt to its narrative while he digressed at length. The former died tragically young, the latter lived far longer than most.
